4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Hydrocarbon solvents are basically non-conductors of electricity and can become electrostatically charged during mixing, filtering or pumping at high flow rates. If this charge reaches a significantly high level, sparks can form that may ignite vapors of

flammable liquids.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

filled, closed container until disposal.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling: Keep away from heat, spark and flame. During use and until all vapors are

gone: Keep area ventilated - do not smoke; extinguish all flames, pilot lights, and heaters; turn off stoves, electrical tools and appliances, and any other sources of ignition. Do not puncture or incinerate pressurized containers. Prevent contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Do not breathe vapor and mist. Wash thoroughly after handling. Do not taste or swallow. Use only with

adequate ventilation.

Storage: Keep in a cool, well ventilated area. Keep away from heat, spark and flame.
