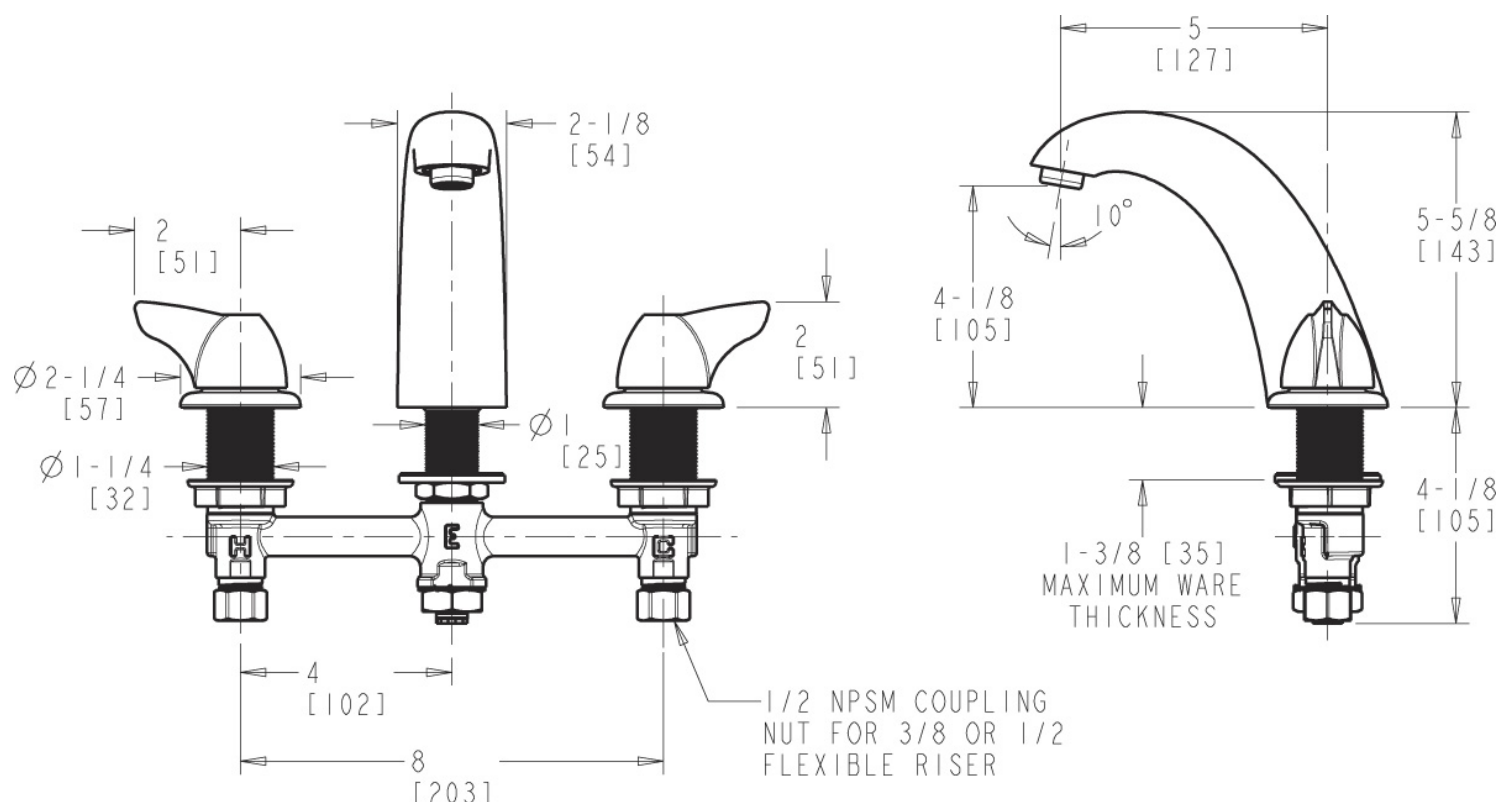

Chicago Faucets No. 405-E74-1000AB, Sink Faucet for hot and cold water, concealed deck-mount with 8" fixed centers, chrome plated. Rigid, cast brass spout, 5" center-to-center. 1.0 GPM (3.8 L/min) pressure compensating, laminar flow non-aerating outlet. 2" metal, vandal-proof, canopy, single-wing handles with secured blue and red index buttons. Quatern™ rebuildable compression cartridge, opens and closes 90°, closes with water pressure, features square, tapered stem. 1/2" NPSM supply inlets and coupling nut for 3/8" or 1/2" flexible riser. ECAST® construction with less than 0.25% lead content by weighted average. This product meets ADA ANSI/ICC A117.1 requirements and is tested and certified to industry standards: ASME A112.18.1/CSA B125.1, Certified to NSF/ANSI 61, Section 9 by CSA, California Health and Safety Code 116875 (AB1953-2006), Vermont Bill S.152, and NSF/ANSI 372 Low Lead Content.



Operation and Maintenance
