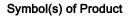

4. First-aid Measures

10. Stability and Reactivity

CONDITIONS TO AVOID: Avoid temperatures above 120°F (49°C). Avoid contact with strong acid and strong bases. Flammable hydrogen gas will evolve when product comes in contact with water or damp air.
